# What has been happening?

#### Street Tag Challenge



We are thrilled to announce that Street Tag now LIVE! The official season has kicked off! Strap on your walking shoes, lace up those running sneakers, hop on your bike, roll on your wheelchair, or glide on your scooter to stay active, earn points, and claim awesome prizes for our school!

#### Additional Tips:

- 1. Tags are worth 50 points and 150 during your power hour.
- 2. You can play Street Tag anywhere. If you go anywhere in the UK, you will find tags for you to collect. No tags? Add your own!
- 3. If you have the scan in the background setting on, you don't have to take your phone out of your pocket
- 4. You can play offline and sync your tags each evening.
- 5. You can sync your smartwatch to the app to register all your steps. 100 steps = 10 points
- 6. As a parent/guardian, you can add 2 children to your account.
- 7. The buildings on the map are Polytags and offer lots of extra points. Your School Team must have a minimum of 15 players to be considered for the prizes on the AVERAGE scoring Leaderboards. It is not too late to join but please only create an account if you are actively taking part as inactive accounts affect our overall score on the leaderboard. Happy tagging!

#### Olympic Drama Workshop, Mrs Booth

We were very lucky this week to take part in a drama workshop based on the Olympic Games. The children learnt about the origins of the Olympics in Ancient Greece and also discussed the variety of sports included in the modern games. One of the activities was to think of water, land and contact events and act them out! We had diving, swimming, running , javelin, karate and judo! The final activity was to create a freeze frame from the ancient games. The children got into groups and had to allocate roles within the group for the scene. We had Gods, athletes, politicians and even a table! The children were given tips to always face the audience and they were fantastic!


#### **Phonics Screening**


We are incredibly lucky to have a brilliant PTA who run some super events for our community and raise money for the schools.


You are automatically part of the PTA as an Alwyn parent/carer. You can support the events by buying tickets, attending events or you could help with the organising and setting up.



Street Tag is a free app where you earn points by collecting virtual tags when you walk, cycle or scoot past them.

Street Tag encourages families to become more physically active which boosts mental health.

When you sign up to the Windsor & Majdenhead Schools Leaderboard. the points you collect will be added to the total for your school and schools with the most points each season will win a prize.




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There are virtual tags all-around Windsor & Maidenhead, including parks, adventure playgrounds and libraries. There are also other tags to collect all around London and the country which you will see in your app.

Once you are within a 40-meter radius of any virtual tag, your app will automatically collect the points, steps can also be synced and converted into Street Tag points.

The app works in offline mode. Your points will be added to the leaderboard when you are back on-line,

## Steps to join the School Team (For PARENTS/CARERS)

- Install the Free STREET TAG app from Play Store/ App Store, Open it and click on Sign up.
- Enter the valid details to Sign up Full name, Username, 02 Email Id, and Password. Then click continue.
- Select the School Leaderboard from the 03 leaderboard options and click continue.
- 04 the list, then pick your school team and click continue.
- Enter your preferred gender, and you can fill in the other 05 optional details if you want. Then click on Sign Up.
- 06 Verify with your Email/ Phone number.
- 07 After the verification step, please answer the questionnaire
- 08 Congratulations! Your account is ready for use.

#### Tips for Parents/Guardians to add a child as a player to their team

01 Create an Email ID for your child.

02 A parent can add a max of 2 children as players C1 and C2.

03 Click on the 'add a child' icon in the settings of the app.

04 Fill in all the details to add a player.

05 Go to the app Settings > Click Profile.

Select your C1 and C2 options and 06 click add to complete activation.

Once a child is added as a player, you will see the 07 C1/C2 option appear on the main map home screen.

While tagging with your children, please 08 click/tap on C1/C2 to collect a tag for them.

#### Features of the App

The average leaderboard displays your rank, school team not and the average scores your school has.

#### Message Board:

This is your message board where you can view regular updates from Street Tag HQ and important announcements or opportunities. You will receive a natification when a new message has been shared, and we recommend you check this board regularly.

# **Penalty Notice Changes**

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

#### First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

#### Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

#### Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

#### Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

#### Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

Penalty Notices will be considered for any 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in 10 weeks. 5 Consecutive days of term time leave can trigger a Penalty Notice

# **Ideas for Learning Chats**

#### What have Reception been learning?

This week we had a Perform drama workshop on the subject of the Olympics. We learnt about the history of the Olympic Games, where they are being held this year and some of the sports that will take place. We continued our phonics learning with 'air' as in hair and 'er' as in builder. We've made life cycle wheels and been learning lots about caterpillars and butterflies.

Ask me to sound out the words 'hairy' and 'farmer'.

Ask me to tell you what I learnt about the Olympics and show you the actions. Ask me to tell you how I'm getting on with the balance bikes in P.E.

Ask me to make you a repeating pattern and tell you the unit of repeat.

Next week we will be learning 'er' and revisiting 'ai' and 'ee' in phonics and thinking about position and mapping in Maths.

#### What has been the learning in Year 1?

This week Year One have been very busy working hard on their seasons poetry. We thought carefully about what happens in each season and then wrote and recited our poems to our class and school adults. What super poets we are! This also linked nicely to our science lesson this week, when we thought about the four seasons and what we might do in each of these.

In maths we have continued to look at time. This week we focused on looking at the analogue clock and telling the time - o'clock and half past.

In our topic lessons this week we used an atlas to identify the countries in the UK and the surrounding seas and oceans. In RE we continued to learn about the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah.

Well done, Year One. Another week of super hard work!

Ask me to recite my seasons poem.

Ask me to tell you the four seasons.

Ask me to tell you in which season the leaves fall off of the trees.

Ask me to tell you the time (when the clock shows an o'clock or half past time).

Ask me to tell you where the minute hand points at an o'clock time.

Ask me to tell you where the minute hand points as an half past time.

Ask me to tell you how Rosh Hashanah is celebrated.

Ask me to tell you which sea surrounds the UK.

#### What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have been busy starting to learn songs for the end of year show this week. We're doing really well but a bit daunted about all of the words we need to learn, but Year 2 will rise to the challenge as they always do! Science has been really interesting comparing the life cycles of different types of animals. We've looked at how humans and other mammals have different life cycles, which are also different to birds, reptiles and amphibians. In maths we've been revising important maths facts, this week it's number bonds. We've been discussing how important number bonds are when calculating and recognising the relationship between numbers.

Ask me to describe the life cycle of a mammal

Ask me to compare the lifecycle of a cow and a human

Ask me to describe the life cycle of a reptile

Ask me to tell you what Hajj is

Ask me to tell you where Mecca is

Ask me to tell you why Hajj is important to Muslims

Ask me to tell you all number bonds to 20
