What have Reception been learning this week?

This week in Reception we have been reading 'Night Monkey, Day Monkey' and looking at things we can see at night and different things during the day. We have also looked at pictures of night monkeys. On No Pens day we really enjoyed bringing things in for Show and Tell. We talked about the things we brought with super confidence and our friends asked us some interesting questions about them. We have also been very busy learning all our songs for the Christmas Performance - we are sure you will be impressed.

Next week Reception will learn the phonic sounds /l/ and /ll/ . In maths, we will be looking at circles and triangles and using positional language.

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

It's been another packed week of activities in Year 1! On Wednesday we all enjoyed a squelchy, muddy walk to Oaken Grove Park. The children used their keen eyes to spot the features pictured on their group's sheet and then had to work out whether it was a Human or a Physical feature. Well done to the children for their brilliant behaviour on their first trip out of school, and a big Thank You to the grown-ups who were able to come along and help. Wednesday was also No Pens Day and the children enjoyed lots of different activities involving talking and listening, including Show and Tell, as well as other describing and listening games. It was great fun!

Ask me to tell you how I described my chosen animal in English. Ask me to tell you about our new story Dear Santa. Ask me about my favourite activity from No Pens Day. Ask me to tell you what 10 - 2 is. Ask me to tell you what I noticed on our trip to the park.

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have been carrying on their learning about shape this week. We have sorted shapes according to their properties realising that some shapes have shared properties such as straight sides and no curved sides. We use a Venn diagram to sort the shapes.

We have also enjoyed innovating the story of Kassim and the Greedy dragon to Sam and the Grumpy Wolf. We had to think about changing the main character, setting and problem of the story. In Science we investigated the properties of wood, cardboard and paper. We discussed which of these materials were most suited to certain objects, for example, chairs and doors.

Ask me to tell you a suitable use for the following materials-

Paper

Cardboard

Wood

Ask me to retell you our innovated story- Sam and the Grumpy Wolf

Ask me to tell you what the warning was that Dad gave to Sam

On Wednesday we had a great time during No Pens day. Our activities included a lego barrier game where we had to tell our partner how to build a shape using lego. This really tested our communication skills as we had to give very clear instructions. We also played Guess Who? We used questioning skills to work out who our partner had chosen. This was made even trickier because the questions had to have a yes or no answer. We ended the day by learning some songs with sign language, we learnt the signing for The UK, countries and the ocean.

Penalty Notice Changes

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19th August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960



Did you know that community pharmacies can now offer clinical appointments with medication available (if required) for five clinical conditions particularly relevant to school age children?

- Ear ache (children aged 1-17)
- Sore throat (over 5s)
- Infected insect bites (over 1s)
- Impetigo (over 1s)
- · Sinusitis (over 12s)

GP practices are busy and making an appointment with them is not always necessary!

When your child is ill with any of these conditions, head straight to your a local community pharmacy where you can have a consultation with a trained clinical professional and receive advice, guidance and even medication if it's needed. Lets get your child on the road to recovery as soon as possible.





The majority of Frimley Health and Care community pharmacies offer the Pharmacy First service.

Remember – if your child has an ear ache, sore throat, impetigo symptoms or a suspected infected insect bite think Pharmacy First.
