

Staffing Update

What have Reception been learning this week?

This week we have been finding out about celebrating Diwali and we had a brilliant Indian dance workshop which we loved! We also started our PE lessons which we had been looking forward to.

Our theme this term is underwater so we did lots of games moving like sea creatures such as crabs and jellyfish.

In our phonics lessons we learnt our first digraph (two letters that make one sound) /ck/ which was fun - especially as it mostly comes at the end of a word.

Ask me to tell you a word that has ck in it.

Where is the ck sound in the word - the beginning, within or the end?

Ask me to tell you the Diwali Story

Ask me to build 2 towers with an equal amount of bricks

Ask me to tell you what happens when chocolate gets hot

Next week Reception will learn the phonic sounds /u/ and /r/. In maths we will be comparing groups.

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

Year One have really enjoyed getting back into the school routine this week. Their teachers loved hearing all about what they got up to in the holidays.

On Tuesday, the children enjoyed a fun filled day with lots of Diwali activities. They took part in a fabulous dance workshop and finished off the day creating beautiful Diwali lanterns. In RE this week, the children learned all about Hinduism and the story of Rama and Sita.

In maths, the children have deepened their knowledge of addition by looking at word problems. They have also represented these word problems in lots of different ways.

In English, we have started a new book 'Dear Zoo' and will use this book over the coming weeks to continue to develop their sentence writing.

Ask me to tell you the story of Rama and Sita and how this relates to Diwali.

Ask me to write the helpful words all, her and when.

Ask me to name as many body parts as I can.

Ask me to tell you what a human feature and a physical feature is.

Ask me to show you firework shapes with my body.

Ask me to tell you all about keeping safe around fireworks.

Ask me to tell you all the bonds of 10.

Ask me to tell you all about our new class text 'Dear Zoo'.

Next week, we will be learning all about addition word problems and introducing subtraction and the minus symbol.

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have had a great first week back. We eased into school with a fun-filled day learning about and celebrating Diwali. The children loved the dance workshop where they learnt and performed a Diwali themed routine with a partner.

In science we learnt about germs and carried out an investigation using hand cream and herbs. It was so intriguing to see how quickly and far germs can spread. If only real germs smelt as good as oregano and cumin!

As geographers, we have been learning about the UK and have pored over our class atlases. We have enjoyed sharing the places we have visited and exploring the capital cities.

Ask me to name the four countries that make up the UK. Ask me to name the capital city for each country.

Ask me what a healthy packed lunch might look like. Ask me why I shouldn't eat unhealthy food regularly.

Ask me what exchange means in maths.

Ask me how I know I need to exchange the ones to a ten.

Next week, we are learning about bread in DT.

Penalty Notice Changes

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19th August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

Penalty Notices will be considered for any 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in 10 weeks. 5 Consecutive days of term time leave can trigger a Penalty Notice
