### What has been happening?

#### Is my child well enough for school?

As the weather changes, we see an increase in colds and illnesses that may cause you to feel less confident with knowing whether your child is well enough to be in school. It is usually appropriate to send your child to school with mild respiratory This would include illnesses. general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. We would encourage you to visit the NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' for further information.



We monitor school attendance very closely in line with the new government rules. If your child's attendance falls below 90% at this point in the school year, we will contact you to discuss the reasons and see if we can offer any support or guidance. We accept that illnesses cannot be helped and if your child is not well enough for school then the call will just clarify illness so **please do not worry if you** receive a phone call as it is part of our usual school procedure.

We would be really grateful if you could send in a box of tissues into your child's class. We go through them quite quickly so appreciate the donations.

#### No Pens Day, Wednesday 27th November

#### What have Reception been learning this week?

This week we were very excited by the snow and sad it didn't settle. However we have had fun exploring ice and what happens to it! We have been sequencing the story Owl Babies and continuing to think about nocturnal animals. We have also been discussing our similarities and differences and thinking about how we are all special.

Ask me to tell you a word that starts with h and a word that starts with b

Ask me to tell you what I liked best in PE this week

Ask me to show you how many different patterns I can make with 4 bricks

Ask me to tell you how we feel when we give presents. Why do we give presents?

Next week Reception will learn the phonic sounds f and ff. In maths, we will be representing quantities to 5, beginning to represent quantities to 10 and recognising numbers to 5. On No Pens Wednesday we would like all the children to bring in something special to them for a special day of Show and Tell, e.g a photograph, object or a toy.

#### What have Year 1 been learning this week?

It's been another busy week in Year 1. On Thursday the children visited Courthouse School to attend a fantastic Kindness workshop and enjoyed making something for someone special to spread our kindness. In Science this week the children have been thinking about the sense of Sight and what you need in order to see. They discovered how tricky it was to aim and throw when you can't see! In Geography the children have enjoyed looking at aerial photographs and comparing these to maps, noticing what is the same and what is different. During PSHE lessons the children have discussed rules, thinking about what they are and why we have them. In English the children have thought of super describing words for different animals and continued to develop their understanding of subtraction in Maths. Well done!

#### Ask me to tell you about our school rules.

Ask me to tell you about Human features and Physical features around where I live.

Ask me to tell you 3 words to describe a lion.

Ask me to show you how to work out 8 - 5 using the crossing out method.

Ask me whether 9 is an odd or an even number.

Ask me to tell you the new sounds in Phonics ('ay' as in tray, 'oy' as in toy).

Ask me to write these words: play, stay, boy, enjoy.

Next week, we will be learning more new sounds in Phonics and enjoying our trip to the park on Wednesday.

#### What have Year 2 been learning this week?

This week in year 2 we have enjoyed being geographers and learning about the physical features in the UK. We have named different physical features in each of the countries and had an interesting discussion about the Loch Ness monster. In English, we continued with Kassim and the Greedy Dragon. We completed an activity called conscience alley which is where we paused at a moment in the story and thought about three questions for Kassim to consider. We thought about whether he should go into the cave, take the treasure and finally fight the dragon. We had a great discussion around these questions and what was the right thing to do.

Ask me to describe a triangle, square and a pentagon using the words: sides and vertices.

Ask me how I can tell if a shape is symmetrical.

Ask me to describe a physical feature in geography.

Ask me to name a physical feature in each country of the UK.

Ask me to name the three qualities of kindness that we learnt from Greg from 52Lives.

Ask me how I can show kindness to those around me.

Next week we will continue with our Science topic of materials and explore the properties of paper and cardboard.

#### Kindness Workshops with Year 1 and 2

Our children went to Courthouse to take part in a kindness workshop. They were beautifully behaved and answered some very thought provoking questions.

Ask your child what act of kindness and creative artwork they did to complete the challenge.

# Penalty Notice Changes

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local

Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

#### First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

#### Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

#### Third Offence Onwards - Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

#### Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

#### Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960


