
our face. No wobbles allowed! We were then taught to throw a jab and a front kick against the pad.

We are now coming to the end of the second week of Street Tag. It is a great app based competition to encourage us all to get out and about, exploring local areas and getting fit.


So far we are 10th on the Leaderboard! Let's all keep finding those tags. It is not too late to download the app and join in.




## We are currently raising money to improve our playground environment with toys and activities as well as work with design companies to create a brand new library for our children. It is very exciting!

# **Penalty Notice Changes**

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local

Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

#### First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

#### Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

#### Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

#### Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

#### Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

## **Ideas for Learning Chats**

#### What have Reception been learning?

This week we have been trying out different sporting activities including archery, kickboxing and basketball. We have started to recap digraphs in Phonics and have been reading 'Oi Frog!' which involves lots of rhyming.

Ask me to give you a string of words that rhyme with 'cat'. Ask me to tell you all about our Sports Festival. Ask me to tell you about my favourite sport activity of the week. Ask me to tell you how to stay safe in the hot weather.

Next week, we will be revisiting 'igh' and 'oa' in Phonics and consolidating number skills in Maths. We'll be having our Sports Day on Thursday morning and taking part in more sports taster sessions.

#### What has been the learning in Year 1?

This week, year one have been learning all about London. They explored the sights in their geography lessons and enjoyed listening to the new class text "Katie in London". The children shared their experiences with each other and discussed if they had visited any of the sights from the book. This week Year 1 also had a fantastic first week of sports fortnight. On Wednesday, they enjoyed a sports festival with Mr Baker where they demonstrated all the skills they have learned this year. On Thursday afternoon, the children enjoyed an exciting and energetic basketball hoops lesson. It was lovely to see them cheering for their friends and celebrating their achievements. Finally on Friday, the grown ups were treated to a sensational sports day! Well done everyone who took part on the day.

- Ask me to describe the location of London on a map (South East).
- Ask me to tell you the four capital cities of the United Kingdom.
- Ask me to show you where Maidenhead is on a map.
- Ask me to retell the story of Katie in London.
- Ask me to tell you what sights Katie and Jack visited.

Ask me to tell you which other London landmarks we have looked at this week

#### What have Year 2 been learning this week?

This week in english we have been learning about the Olympics. We have looked at the history of the Olympics and the Olympic events. We also learnt that the Olympics have been cancelled three times and postponed once! In maths, we have been learning about measures. We have been rotating the resources to allow us to explore capacity, temperature and mass practically. As geographers, we are continuing to explore Kenya. This week we have compared the lives of a child in Kenya with a child in the UK. In addition to all this work in the classroom, we are also continuing to practise our performances for the Year 2 concert.

Ask me why the Olympics were cancelled three times. Ask me why the Olympics were postponed once. Ask me what units we use to measure mass. Ask me what units we use to measure capacity. Ask me to name the 4 stages in the lifecycle of a butterfly. Ask me to name 2 animals whose lifecycles begin with an egg.
