A Fantastic Music Week, Mrs Booth

The children at Alwyn had a very musical time. As part of our annual music week we've had drumming, singing, parents and teachers performing and much more.

We started on Monday with delivering a Sing and Sign workshop. We learnt how to sing a song about sunshine using signs. Claire not only sang the songs but she had also written them. Thank you Claire.

Bridget and her recorder group came to perform on Monday afternoon. They treated us to some fabulous music and showed us all of the different types of recorders they have from the tiny sopranino to the huge contra bass.

On Tuesday, Years 1 and 2 took part in a junk drumming workshop with Paul from Drum Runners. They practised drumming patterns and songs and played instruments that had been made entirely from unwanted items such as pipes, barrels and even bicycle wheels! Reception took part in a singing session with Ziggy's music. They sang songs about arctic animals and played lots of percussion instruments.

Is my child well enough for school?

The increase in colds and illnesses may cause you to feel less confident with knowing if your child is well enough for school. It is fine to send your child to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. School lunches for infant age children are fully funded so parents do not pay for them. They are yummy!


School Attendance and Punctuality Phone Calls

We monitor school attendance very closely in line with local and government rules. If your child's attendance is below 90%, we will contact you over the next few weeks to discuss the reasons and see if we can offer any support or guidance. We accept that illnesses cannot be helped and if your child is not well enough for school then the call will just clarify illness so please do not worry if you receive a phone call as it is part of our usual school procedure.

For every day your child is absent from school, over 6 hours of instructional time is lost.

Penalty Notice Changes

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Attendance, Punctuality and Penalty Notices on 19th August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local

Authorities. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Head of School or Headteacher.

First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrate's court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child. For example, 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

What have Reception been learning this week?

This week in Reception we have had great fun listening to and joining in with musical activities. We have had parents come into school and play different instruments which was interesting. Music week kicked off with a brilliant sing and sign assembly where we sang songs about the sun and different activities we could do. We have had the opportunity to play lots of different instruments in our outside area. On Thursday we had a fun singing and movement session with Ziggy's. We sang songs and waddled about like penguins in the South pole, and got to play instruments and pretend we were in an orchestra! Do ask me what my favourite music activity was!

Ask me to tell you a word that starts with w and a word that has x in it

Ask me to show you how to build 5 towers, of 1,2,3,4,5 and ask what can I notice

Ask me about the Ziggy's music session we had Ask me what musical instruments we saw and heard this week Ask me to tell you the story Jonty Gentoo

Next week Reception will be learning the graphemes y and z. In maths, we are looking at the composition of 5 and weighing and mass.

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

This week we have really enjoyed a range of music workshops. We did drumming and learnt about beats, we listened to a woodwind band and enjoyed learning how to sign along to a song we sang. We also enjoyed a Boomwhaker workshop and learnt how to play along to a song. We started weaving practise in Art inspired by the artist Margot Selby and we compared Old Alwyn School to New Alwyn School in history.

Ask me to name a conjunction.

Ask me to use the conjunction 'and' in a sentence.

Ask me to use the conjunction 'because' in a sentence.

Ask me to read the following words: yawn, dawn, jigsaw, withdraw, lawn.

Ask me to tell you 1 more than these numbers: 4, 8, 17, 12. Ask me to tell you 1 less than these numbers: 3, 16, 20, 14.

Next week we will be creating our own Lost and Found story by changing parts of the story we've been learning.

They run brilliant events throughout the year but need your help. Please get in touch with them if you wish to take part or have some great ideas to share.




Smartphone Free Childhood

We look forward to seeing you all.


